HILLSDALE - LAKE OSWEGO REGIONAL TRAIL



To Hillsdale

0.7 miles

Go right along Capitol Hill Rd to the entrance of Stephens Creek Nature Park, just past 17th Dr. Follow the HI-LO signs directing you to the boardwalk and stairs. At the top of the stairs is a wooden kiosk with the next map and additional information.

To Lake Oswego

5.6 miles

Follow the gravel path going south on 19th Ave toward Barbur Blvd. This section of the HI-LO trail connects unimproved streets and improved trails through quiet neighborhoods to stairs leading up to Barbur Blvd where you will find the next map on your right.



Welcome to the HI-LO Trail

The HI-LO trail is a 6.3-mile walk between Hillsdale and Lake Oswego. You'll encounter forests, restored wetlands, a waterfall, and spectacular views. Parts of the trail pass through residential areas, so be careful when crossing roads. You'll find cafés and eateries along the way.

Survey Crew

The Land Ordinance of 1785 established the Public Land Survey System and organized land into a system of square grids, usually measuring six miles to a side. Each square was called a "Township," and was further divided into thirty six smaller 640-acre "Sections." Surveys of Oregon and Washington State used the point of the Willamette Stone in the West Hills as their origin. All townships in Oregon and Washington are referenced by their distance from that marker. Bureau of Land Management records show that what is now the 19th Ave right-of-way began as the section line between two Donation Land Claim properties, established in the mid-19th century.
