HILLSDALE - LAKE OSWEGO REGIONAL TRAIL



To Hillsdale

2.8 miles

Go up the stairs to Arnold St. Turn right and follow Arnold to 11th Dr. Turn right at 11th and follow the HI-LO signs into Marshall Park. Cross the stone bridge to the next map in Marshall Park near the playground. Be aware of exposed tree roots along the way.

To Lake Oswego

3.5 miles

Proceed along the trail under the Boone's Ferry Bridge. Climb the stairs on the east side of Boone's Ferry Rd. Turn left and continue south on Boone's Ferry to the next map at the North Creek Trailhead of Tryon Creek State Natural Area.



Welcome to the HI-LO Trail

The HI-LO trail is a 6.3-mile walk between Hillsdale and Lake Oswego. You'll encounter forests, restored wetlands, a waterfall, and spectacular views. Parts of the trail pass through residential areas, so be careful when crossing roads. You'll find cafés and eateries along the way.

Native American Residency

Native American residency along the west bank of the lower Willamette River and in the West Hills toward the Tualatin Plains runs deep in the human experience in western Oregon. The Burnett Site, an archaeological deposit in Old Town, Lake Oswego, is dated to over 7,000 years BP (Before Present). The site, located on a bluff about six miles downstream from Willamette Falls (pictured), overlooks the Willamette River near George Rogers Park. The Burnett Site is the oldest, dated village site on the Willamette Valley floor. Scan the QR code above to learn more.
